APPLICATION PROCESS

Adoption, Custody, Divorce, or Guardianship Cases

For matters relating to adoption, custody, divorce, or guardianship a petition will need to be filed with the Tribal Court. Contact the Clerk of the Court at 907.463.7165 for information on how to file your petition.

Child Support or Paternity Cases

Child support and paternity is established through Central Council's Tribal Child Support Unit (TCSU). Please contact TCSU at 907.463.7132 if you are in need of child support or paternity assistance.

Domestic Violence Protection Orders

ABOUT US

The Judiciary Committee and Tribal Court System was created to foster and protect the Tribe's inherent and sovereign rights to resolve issues and disputes of and among its tribal citizens, including their families and children.

Authority and responsibilities have been conveyed to the Tribe's Judicial System with the passage of Title 6. The Judiciary Committee serves as the Tribal Assembly's liaison to the Tribal Court System, which derives its authority from Article XI of Central Council's Constitution.

PURPOSE

The Judicial Branch, exercising the Tribe's inherent sovereignty, provides a user friendly, culturally appropriate forum for tribal citizens and others to address basic judicial needs. These services are performed using the traditional values of respect, patience, and commitment to safeguard the future of the Tribe by promoting healthy families and children.



SERVICES

The Tribal Court is available for and has subject matter jurisdiction over a large range of civil and criminal issues including:

- Adoptions
- Child Custody
- Child Support
- Divorce
- Domestic Violence
- Guardianships
- Juvenile Diversion
- Marriage
- Paternity

ELIGIBILITY

If you are a tribally enrolled citizen of Central Council or are eligible for enrollment with the Tribe, or have signed a Consent to Court Jurisdiction form, you may obtain services through the Tribal Court. If you are a parent, custodian, or guardian of a tribally enrolled child or the spouse or intimate partner of a tribal citizen you are also eligible to receive services through the Tribal Court. And, in some cases, if you are none of the above, the Tribal Court may still be available to assist you.
