Resolution TA 18-28

Title: Explore a Partnership with the Seattle Indian Health Board to Expand Tribal TANF Services to King County

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 30,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida's tribal citizens reside in villages and urban communities throughout the United States, including the greater Seattle area and King County; and

WHEREAS, the SIHB is recognized as an American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) community service provider; and

WHEREAS, the Seattle Indian Health Board's (SIHB) second largest tribal community utilizing its health and human services are Tlingit & Haida tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, the SIHB serves as a gathering place for our Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, tribal citizens of all tribes are currently unable to receive tribal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) services in King County, because there are not tribal providers of TANF authorized for King County; and

WHEREAS, the SIHB has expressed its willingness to explore incorporating Tribal TANF services into the current breadth of services being offered at its clinic;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eighty-Third Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened in Juneau, Alaska on April 18-20, 2018, hereby supports Tlingit & Haida's continued investigation of an agreement with the Seattle Indian Health Board concerning the expansion of Tribal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families services to tribal citizens in King County.


