Resolution TA 20-15

Title: Addition of Elizabeth Wanamaker Peratrovich to the International Civil Rights: Walk of Fame

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 32,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historic Site in Atlanta, Georgia recognizes many national and international leaders that contributed to the civil rights movement as memorialized in the International Civil Rights: Walk of Fame; and

WHEREAS, missing from this site is Elizabeth Wanamaker Peratrovich, recognized as one of the preeminent civil rights leaders who called out the racism against Alaska Natives and was instrumental in the passage of the 1945 Alaska (Territory) Civil Rights Act; and

WHEREAS the State of Alaska recognizes and celebrates Elizabeth Peratrovich Day annually on February 16<sup>th</sup> and the day is celebrated by Tlingit & Haida communities in other states;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eighty-Fifth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened on October 1, 2020, hereby requests the addition of Elizabeth Wanamaker Peratrovich to the International Civil Rights: Walk of Fame, a National Historic Site in Atlanta, Georgia.

ADOPTED this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 2020, by the Eighty-Fifth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska.


